Safe Schools Coalition Annual Report 2008

We celebrated the Coalition's 20th anniversary in 2008 with a reunion to honor our amazing volunteers. We were fortunate to host two **Justserve Americorps members**, Adrienne Woody and Ethan Blustein, from Solid Ground, and **intern**, Kyle Rapinan, then a senior at Shorecrest High School. We **contracted** with three wonderful individuals, Kristina Armenakis, Helen Stillman and Gabi Clayton. We were honored as **Grand Marshals** of the 2008 Seattle Pride Parade; we also had our **yellow school bus** packed with jubilant families and volunteers.

We mourned the passing this year of a dear friend and colleague, a founder and staunch supporter of the Coalition, Washington Education Association General Counsel, **Jerry Painter**.

Accomplishments & Services

- Our Web Site added music, video and an entire youth section, including new pages on cyber-bullying and social networking. The site, www.safeschoolscoalition.org, got 2.4 million hits from 318,118 educators, students, family members and allies in 176 countries, on every continent except Antarctica. We also launched MySpace, Facebook and LinkedIn pages in 2008.
- Our List Serve added a new team of volunteer staff people and sent a total of 355 messages to 905 subscribers in 11 countries, 44 U.S. states plus Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico, 5 Canadian provinces and 27 counties in Washington State. We were a lifeline to people in rural and conservative places, a system for researchers and reporters to find interviewees, and a vehicle to enhance communication among education practitioners, academics, students and families, and the community.
- Our dispatchers received calls from 108 individuals in 2008. They referred 30 of those students and families to Intervention Specialists for crisis counseling, advocacy, and referral, including 26 brief and 4 in-depth interventions. Intervention Specialists participated in a two-day retreat. We saw a surge of 9 new volunteers. And we surveyed King County school nurses to assess districts' utilization of our posters informing students and staff that there's a safe place to call about anti-LGBTQ violence.
- Our Panelists, Speakers and Trainers (in partnership with American Friends Service Committee) trained 983 adults and 1,352 youth in 2008. Fourteen speakers and trainers, 32 youth panelists and 10 panel facilitators did a combined total of 77 workshops, for conferences and in public and private schools (K-12 and university) in Washington State and in Connecticut, Louisiana and Oklahoma.

- We hosted a Northwest premiere of the remarkable documentary, It's STILL Elementary: The Movie and the Movement with director Debra Chasnoff and a panel of teachers and all-grown-up students. We dedicated the showing to Lawrence King, the middle schooler gunned down this year by a classmate, allegedly for asking him to be his Valentine, and we supported a second showing for the University of Washington, School of Social Work.
- We hosted a lecture by Dr. Caitlin Ryan, Executive Director of the Family Acceptance Project at the Cesar Chavez Institute at San Francisco State University, whose work helps families support and protect their lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning and gender variant children.
- We held a successful all-ages benefit comedy night, Laugh at Loud, at the Comedy Underground, with support from the volunteer comedians of Nonprofit Comedy.
- We served as Community Co-presenters, along with Families United Against Hate and the Matthew Shepard Foundation, for a Seattle Lesbian & Gay Film Festival showing of D. Lee Inosanto's remarkable film *The Sensei*, a full-length feature film that will change hearts and minds.
- We began offering to analyze the data and synthesize it into a school-specific report, for any high school GSA's wanting to conduct GSA Network's Climate Survey in their school.
- We provided two all-day continuing education workshops, on racism and white privilege and on working with trans youth, featuring nationally respected trainers Truc Nguyen and Carla Odiega, respectively, for Safe Schools Coalition volunteers and member organizations.

- We were integrally involved in the launching of a National Safe Schools Roundtable website and a searchable database for groups doing LGBTQ safe schools work and for funders.
- Our technical assistance contributed to retaining bullying questions on Washington State's biannual Healthy Youth Survey, enhancing a teachers' guide on masculinity to be published soon by Scenarios USA, and strengthening laws in several states and policies in a number of districts.
- Our newly formed Law & Policy Work Group spent much of 2008 beginning to forge a long-term legislative agenda.
