(1) SHARING:

- Matt's position has gotten continued funding. Yay. Matt also reported that **Planned Parenthood of the Great NW** has bought two copies of the film *Straightlaced* for their ed team's use around the region.
- Frieda reminded folks that the National Queer Asian Pacific Islander Conference - "**Transgress, Transform, Transcend**" – will be at the University of Washington campus Aug 14-16, 2009!!!! More info: www.ngapia.org. Frieda also reported that Seattle's **Wing Luke Museum** has an LGBT API exhibit right now (Across the Spectrum: Stories from Queer Asian Pacific America, on display through February 14, 2010 -- www.wingluke.org)
- Kyle reported on an upcoming OUTSpoken youth panel at the **Moving the Margins** training at **Casey Family Services**. Kyle also talked about a WAFT Training at SSC and reported that Casey bought some copies of *Straightlaced*
- Chris reported that **King County Sexual Assault Resource Center** is studying gaps in cyber safety for youth. Most internet safety training misses the mark, failing to specifically target kids that are most at risk of being sexually exploited on line (those with a history of prior exploitation, queer and questioning boys, kids who engage in online risk behavior). So far they've focused work with service providers; we discussed ways to reach youth-at-risk and possible collaborations among agencies. Beth will follow up about PHSKC and KCSARC possibly co-teaching at juvenile detention. Hanna and Matt offered their groups for piloting new cyber safety education.
- Hanna discussed her summer Fellowship at **Washington Bus**, a youth driven nonprofit fostering democracy and voter engagement. **DID YOU KNOW that the average age of primary voter is 62???!?** The Bus and the Recording Academy and the Stranger present a FREE forum called Candidate Survivor - the biggest, best, and possibly sexiest event of the political season. **Candidate Survivor is your chance to get Seattle's future leaders onto our turf, answering our questions. Tuesday, July 28th at the Showbox at the Market, from 7 to 9.** There will be a Survivor contest: throughout the evening, the audience will be voting candidates off-stage. More: www.washingtonbus.org
- Briana, the Coalition's new **OUTSpoken** (speakers' bureau and youth panels) Manager introduced herself. She has a Masters in Social Work from the University of Washington and is finishing up an internship providing mental health therapy at

Seattle Counseling Service for Sexual Minorities. Her background includes work at Tyee and Odyssey High Schools and Seattle Young People's Project and her perspective includes strong social justice and youth empowerment lenses.

- Paul introduced himself as a teacher (currently tutoring) involved at regional **Quaker** organizations
- Gabi reported that **PFLAG Olympia** will do a screening of *Straightlaced* in the fall. Gabi also reported on an exciting Thurston County coalition called "**The Pizza Klatch**" (www.pizzaklatch.org) which offers facilitated support for GLBTQ youth and their allies. The support is offered during high school lunch periods, with free pizza, to provide a convenient and safe forum for the discussion of topics important to these youths.
